an in depth biography of field marshal erwin rommel written with the cooperation of rommel s son by a renowned military analyst and historian who is himself a general

written directly after combat rommel critiques his own battle strategies and tactics during world war i in an attempt to learn further from his losses and victories

field marshal erwin rommel exerted an almost hypnotic influence not only over his own troops but also over the allied soldiers of the eighth army in world war ii even when the legend surrounding his invincibility was overturned at el alamein the aura surrounding rommel himself remained unsullied in this classic study of the art of war rommel analyzes the tactics that lay behind his success first published in 1937 it quickly became a highly regarded military textbook and also brought its author to the attention of adolph hitler rommel was to subsequently advance through the ranks to the high command in world war ii though most people immediately connect rommel with the african campaigns of world war ii he made his initial legendary giant steps during the first world war in this 1935 title he recalls his greatest battles outlines how he won them and provides his strategies on the use of armor in the field lessons ultimately used by patton and other allied tank commanders to defeat him library journal as a leader of a small unit in the first world war rommel proved himself an aggressive and versatile commander with a reputation for using the battleground terrain to his own advantage for gathering intelligence and for seeking out and exploiting enemy weaknesses rommel graphically describes his own achievements and those of his units in the swift moving battles on the western front in the ensuing trench warfare in the 1917 campaign in romania and in the pursuit across the tagliamento and piave rivers this classic account seeks out the basis of his astonishing leadership skills providing an indispensable guide to the art of war written by one of its greatest exponents

nicknamed the desert fox for his cunning command of the afrika korps erwin rommel remains one of the most popular and studied of germany s world war ii commanders he got his first taste of combat in world war i where his daring command earned him the blue max germany s highest decoration for bravery he followed this up with numerous successes early in world war ii in both europe and africa before facing his biggest challenge organizing the defence of france implicated in the plot to kill hitler rommel chose suicide over a public trial this book looks at the life of this daring soldier focusing on his style of command and the tactical decisions that earned him his fearsome reputation

field marshal erwin rommel was the most popular soldier of world war ii under his leadership the german afrika korps advanced all the way to egypt known as the desert fox rommel was considered invincible that is the story told in the history books ralf georg reuth paints a different portrait of erwin rommel a picture of a man who owed his fame in part to nazi propaganda and whose role in the resistance is still unclear the image of a soldier who was promoted by hitler and who continued to stay true to him until the end when he committed suicide at the behest of his führer his personal fate is the mirror image of the german tragedy of that time to have followed the führer to the end and to believe that one had thereby done one s patriotic duty

includes pictures includes rommel s quotes about his life and the war includes online resources and a bibliography for further reading be an example to your men in your duty and in private life never spare yourself and let the troops see that you don t in your endurance of fatigue and privation always be tactful and well mannered and teach your subordinates to be the same avoid excessive sharpness or harshness of voice which usually indicates the man who has shortcomings of his own to hide erwin rommel one of his biographers called him a complex man a born leader a brilliant soldier a devoted husband a proud father intelligent instinctive brave compassionate vain egotistical and arrogant as that description suggests every account of erwin rommel s life must address what appears to be its inherent contradictions fittingly and in the same vein he remains one of the best remembered generals of world war ii and history at large despite the fact he was on the losing side and he was defeated at the most famous battle of his career the decisive battle of el alamein nonetheless the desert fox has been a legend on both sides of the atlantic for over 70 years thanks to the crucial role he played in history s deadliest conflict before his legendary encounters against the british and americans in north africa rommel gained much fame for his role in the invasions of poland and france before was sent to north africa in february 1941 in describing rommel the italian officer alessandro predieri talked about his two very rare and precious gifts the first is luck which you will remember napoleon prescribed to his generals the second gift is that of being able to keep his bearings in the midst of all the confusion of modern desert warfare his instinct tells him immediately where a difficult situation is going to develop and off he goes with his kampfstaffel headquarters group which he treats like a praetorian quard and puts things right charging around like a junior officer with the axis forces trying to push through egypt towards the suez canal and the british mandate of palestine american forces landed to their west in north africa which ultimately compelled rommel to try to break through before the allies could build up and overwhelm them with superior numbers the second battle of el alamein was a turning point in the two year conflict between allied forces and a combined german italian force in north africa while the scale of the battle paled in comparison to the battles of the eastern front where the majority of german troops were

concentrated it still marked an important victory in world war ii especially from the british perspective after leaving north africa rommel spent much of the later part of the war strengthening german defenses across the atlantic in anticipation of an amphibious allied landing which would come in june 1944 but the murky role he played in the notorious july 20 plot on adolf hitler s life in 1944 the closest an assassination attempt got to killing the nazi fuhrer would bring about the desert fox s untimely demise in october 1944 even as the soviets and western allies were tightening the vise on germany compelled to take cyanide by authorities the desert fox insisted he was innocent until his dying day and his popularity forced the nazi government to claim his death was brought about by a heart attack or a cerebral embolism in fact rommel was given an official state funeral and winston churchill would go on to praise him he also deserves our respect because although a loyal german soldier he came to hate hitler and all his works and took part in the conspiracy to rescue germany by displacing the maniac and tyrant for this he paid the forfeit of his life

john keegan s brilliant look at the meaning of leadership in the mask of command john keegan asks us to consider questions that are seldom asked what is the definition of leadership what makes a great military leader why is it that men indeed sometimes entire nations follow a single leader often to victory but with equal dedication also to defeat dozens of names come to mind napoleon lee charlemagne hannibal castro hussein from a wide array keegan chooses four commanders who profoundly influenced the course of history alexander the great the duke of wellington ulysses s grant and adolph hitler all powerful leaders each cast in a different mold each with diverse results the mask of command is a companion volume to john keegan s classic study of the individual soldier the face of battle together they form a masterpiece of military and human history

this study focuses on the operational level of war that level which links tactics to strategy the study seeks to identify and define principles applicable to the operational level of war if valid those principles ought to guide and or govern the conduct of war at the operational level also understanding of operational principles and the theoretical foundations of the operational level of war can assist us army commanders and staff officers in preparation for and conduct of war at that level selected campaigns and battles conducted by erwin rommel and bernard montgomery during world war ii are analyzed the objective of the analyses is to determine what each commander considered as guides in making battlefield decisions the research is not limited however to specific campaigns and battles a description of each commander is offered that is his experiences and the evolution of his military thought the prevailing german and british military doctrines are also reviewed interestingly the criteria each commander used in making battlefield decisions his operational principles are apparent by understanding the man and the doctrine the campaign and battle analyses serve to substantiate those principles while rommel and montgomery represented different styles of war fighting maneuver and attrition respectively they demonstrated a remarkable commonality in battlefield decision making apparently the operational level of war can accommodate a broad range of war fighting styles and instruments the implications for the us army derived from this study cover a wide range of subjects some involve organization training and preparation of operational level commanders and staff officers most important is the development of an army which can successfully fight the campaigns and battles in future war

in 1940 a british offensive in the western desert provoked a major italian military disaster by early february 1941 the whole of cyrenaica had been lost and german help became necessary to avoid the loss of all of libya on 14 february 1941 the first echelons of german troops hurriedly arrived at the port of tripoli starting the 27 month german engagement in northern africa this book covers the complex and oft changing organisation and structure of german forces in north africa from their first deployment through to the conclusion of the battle of el alamein an engagement that irrevocably changed the strategic situation in the western desert
