in this groundbreaking book leading arab and jewish intellectuals examine how and why the holocaust and the nakba are interlinked without blurring fundamental differences between them it searches for a new historical and political grammar for relating and narrating their complicated intersections

in this companion book to the pbs documentary scheduled to air in may the realities of the holocaust emerge through the remarkable accounts of 27 eyewitnesses photos

this edition is the first of its kind to offer a basic collection of facsimile english language historical articles on all aspects of the extermination of the european jews a total of 300 articles from 84 journals and collections allows the reader to gain an overview of this field the edition both provides access to the immense rich array of scholarly articles published after 1960 on the history of the holocaust and encourages critical assessment of conflicting interpretations of these horrifying events the series traces nazi persecution of jews before the implementation of the final solution demonstrates how the germans coordinated anti jewish activities in conquered territories and sheds light on the victims in concentration camps ending with the liberation of the concentration camp victims and articles on the trials of war criminals the publications covered originate from the years 1950 to 1987 included are authors such as jakob katz saul friedländer eberhard jäckel bruno bettelheim and herbert a strauss

in april 1945 british troops liberated the camp and mira was eventually reunited with her father most of the other members of her family had perished

prior to hitler's occupation nearly 120 000 jews inhabited the areas that would become the protectorate of bohemia and moravia by 1945 all but a handful had either escaped or been deported and murdered by the nazis this pioneering study gives a definitive account of the holocaust as it was carried out in the region detailing the german and czech policies including previously overlooked measures such as small town ghettoization and forced labor that shaped jewish life drawing on extensive new evidence wolf gruner demonstrates how the persecution of the jews as well as their reactions and resistance efforts were the result of complex actions by german authorities in prague and berlin as well as the czech government and local authorities

the testament to a tragedy voices from the holocaust follows the whole history of the shoah from hitler s rise to power to the nuremburg trials but of course the exterminations and death camps of the final solution take centre stage it tells the story from the perspective of the people who were there and were witnesses on both sides of the horror while some of the eye witnesses are well known such as anne frank primo levi and heinrich himmler the book includes recollections of camp inmates ss totenkopf guards and the british soldiers who liberated belsen shocking powerful and personal voices from the holocaust retells history written by those who were there

this books takes a new and critical look at the development of logotherapy and existential analysis a prominent existential school of psychotherapy it explores the intellectual and political biography of its founder the austrian psychiatrist and holocaust survivor viktor frankl best known for his bestselling man s search for meaning the book focuses on his life and works and political thinking from the late 1920 s to the years spent in nazi occupied vienna and finally the time he spent in the concentration camps theresienstadt auschwitz and dachau it presents new archival findings on frankl s involvement with the austrian zionist movement his attempts to sabotage the euthanasia program of the national socialists and his scathing critiques of the ns psychotherapy school around göring and his students published during the years before frankl s deportation to theresienstadt this book addresses recent attempts by the author timothy pytell to portray frankl as a fellow traveler of the nazi regime and corrects the fundamental errors and misrepresentations in pytell s work it thus offers important perspectives on the intellectual history of ideas in psychology and existential psychotherapy and also serves as key material on the development of psychotherapy before and during the holocaust

thousands of people have been honored for saving jews during the holocaust but not a single arab looking for a hopeful response to the plague of holocaust denial sweeping across the arab and muslim worlds robert satloff sets off on a quest to find the arab hero whose story will change the

way arabs view jews themselves and their own history the story of the holocaust s long reach into the arab world is difficult to uncover covered up by desert sands and desert politics we follow satloff over four years through eleven countries from the barren wasteland of the sahara where thousands of jews were imprisoned in labor camps through the archways of the mosque in paris which may once have hidden 1700 jews to the living rooms of octogenarians in london paris and tunis the story is very cinematic the characters are rich and handsome brave and cowardly there are heroes and villains the most surprising story of all is why more than sixty years after the end of the war so few people arab and jew want this story told

national jewish book award finalist 2012 part of the jewish encounter series the capture of ss lieutenant colonel adolf eichmann by israeli agents in argentina in may of 1960 and his subsequent trial in jerusalem by an israeli court electrified the world the public debate it sparked on where how and by whom nazi war criminals should be brought to justice and the international media coverage of the trial itself was a watershed moment in how the civilized world in general and holocaust survivors in particular found the means to deal with the legacy of genocide on a scale that had never been seen before award winning historian deborah e lipstadt gives us an overview of the trial and analyzes the dramatic effect that the survivors courtroom testimony which was itself not without controversy had on a world that had until then regularly commemorated the holocaust but never fully understood what the millions who died and the hundreds of thousands who managed to survive had actually experienced as the world continues to confront the ongoing reality of genocide and ponder the fate of those who survive it this trial of the century which has become a touchstone for judicial proceedings throughout the world offers a legal moral and political framework for coming to terms with unfathomable evil lipstadt infuses a gripping narrative with historical perspective and contemporary urgency

when representing the holocaust the slightest hint of narrative embellishment strikes contemporary audiences as somehow a violation against those who suffered under the nazis this anxiety is at least in part rooted in theodor adorno s dictum that to write poetry after auschwitz is barbaric and despite the fact that he later reversed his position the conservative opposition to all artistic representations of the holocaust remains powerful leading to the insistent demand that it be represented as it really was and yet whether it s the girl in the red dress or a german soldier belting out bach on a piano during the purge of the ghetto in schindler s list or the use of tracking shots in the documentaries shoah and night and fog all genres invent or otherwise embellish the narrative to locate meaning in an event that we commonly refer to as unimaginable this wide ranging book surveys and discusses the ways in which the holocaust has been represented in cinema covering a deep cross section of both national cinemas and genres
