volume ii of iii this volume is sub titled the battle of st mihiel and covers st mihiel pont a mouson and metz the first 18 pages provide the historical background how the st mihiel salient was formed in september 1914 and how it was eventually eliminated four years later in september 1918 details of the american forces corps and divisions involved are given with photos of some of their commanders then follow the outlines of three guided tours round the battlefields with comments on the scenes of interest and accounts of the fighting

the first tour covers verdun to commercey via calonne trench eparges apremont forest ailly wood and st mihiel including a visit to the latter the next trip goes from commercey to metz via pont a mousson and including a visit to pretre wood where there was heavy fighting from sep 1914 to may 1915 when it finally passed into french hands and remained there it ends with a tour of metz the third tour runs from metz to verdun via etain the main place of interest visited on this leg which does not take in the verdun battlefield good maps and battlefield photos all make this an interesting piece of wwi history

world war i began in august 1914 the united states did not enter the conflict until april 1917 during those nearly three years of neutrality a small number of americans did experience the horrors of the war zones of europe some ran for their lives as refugees while others like journalists and doctors headed toward the fighting missionaries in persia iran and the ottoman empire became witnesses to both the armenian genocide and the persecution of assyrian christians this history focuses on the war from the perspective of ordinary people who found themselves in the midst of what was then the most destructive and bloody war in history

although america is unquestionably a nation of immigrants its immigration policies have inspired more questions than consensus on who should be admitted and what the path to citizenship should be in americans in waiting hiroshi motomura looks to a forgotten part of our past to show how for over 150 years immigration was assumed to be a transition to citizenship with immigrants essentially being treated as future citizens americans in waiting challenging current conceptions the author deftly uncovers how this view once so central to law and policy has all but vanished motomura explains how america could create a more unified society by recovering this lost history and by giving immigrants more but at the same time asking more of them a timely panoramic chronicle of immigration and citizenship in the united states americans in waiting offers new ideas and a fresh perspective on current debates

in the 1600s over 350 000 intrepid english men women and children migrated to america leaving behind their homeland for an uncertain future whether they settled in jamestown salem or barbados these migrants entrepreneurs soldiers and pilgrims alike faced one incontrovertible truth england was a very very long way away in between two worlds celebrated historian malcolm gaskill tells the sweeping story of the english experience in america during the first century of colonization following a large and varied cast of visionaries and heretics merchants and warriors and slaves and rebels gaskill brilliantly illuminates the often traumatic challenges the settlers faced the first waves sought to recreate the english way of life even to recover a society that was vanishing at home but they were thwarted at every turn by the perils of a strange continent unaided by monarchs who first ignored then exploited them as these colonists strove to leave their mark on the new world they were forced by hardship and hunger by illness and infighting and by bloody and desperate battles with indians to innovate and adapt or perish as later generations acclimated to the wilderness they recognized that they had evolved into something distinct no longer just the english in america they were perhaps not even english at all these men and women were among the first white americans and certainly the most prolific and as gaskill shows in learning to live in an unforgiving world they had begun a long and fateful journey toward rebellion and finally independence

acclaimed journalist charlie glass looks to the american expatriate experience of nazi occupied paris to reveal a fascinating forgotten history of the greatest generation in americans in paris tales of adventure intrigue passion deceit and survival unfold season by season from the spring of 1940 to liberation in the summer of 1944 as renowned journalist

charles glass tells the story of a remarkable cast of expatriates and their struggles in nazi paris before the second world war began approximately thirty thousand americans lived in paris and when war broke out in 1939 almost five thousand remained as citizens of a neutral nation the americans in paris believed they had little to fear they were wrong glass s discovery of letters diaries war documents and police files reveals as never before how americans were trapped in a web of intrigue collaboration and courage artists writers scientists playboys musicians cultural mandarins and ordinary businessmen all were swept up in extraordinary circumstances and tested as few americans before or since charles bedaux a french born naturalized american millionaire determined his alliances as a businessman first a decision that would ultimately make him an enemy to all countess clara longworth de chambrun was torn by family ties to president roosevelt and the vichy government but her fiercest loyalty was to her beloved american library of paris sylvia beach attempted to run her famous english language bookshop shakespeare company while helping her jewish friends and her colleagues in the resistance dr sumner jackson wartime chief surgeon of the american hospital in paris risked his life aiding allied soldiers to escape to britain and resisting the occupier from the first day these stories and others come together to create a unique portrait of an eccentric original diverse american community charles glass has written an exciting fast paced and elegant account of the moral contradictions faced by americans in paris during france s dangerous occupation years for four hard years from the summer of 1940 until u s troops liberated paris in august 1944 americans were intimately caught up in the city s fate americans in paris is an unforgettable tale of treachery by some cowardice by others and unparalleled bravery by a few

presents the history of the united states from the point of view of those who were exploited in the name of american progress

there is a common belief that until recently americans have preferred isolation to interest in remote areas such as southeast asia this thesis can be tested by examining the history of american relations with a place on the opposite side of the globe from the united states such a land is sumatra it is one of the largest islands in the world its 166 789 square mile area exceeds that of the third largest american state california and is larger than italy lying halfway around the world from the united states its 1050 mile length is almost divided by the equator which runs across it for 285 miles sumatra s strategic importance is two fold firstly it is the first island stepping stone from the asiatic mainland into the australasian

archipelago this was demonstrated in 1942 when the united states stationed planes on sumatra in an attempt to stem the japanese advance southward secondly it lies athwart the shortest sea routes from eastern asia to europe and the eastern united states sumatra s southern tip forms one side of the straits of sunda which guards the access to the java china and philippine seas at the island s northern tip is the entrance to the straits of malacca the shortest sea lane between the near and far east the opening of the sues canal in 1869 shifted the shortest route between the far east and the western world from the sunda to the malacca straits

american independence was inevitable by 1780 but british writers spent the several decades following the american revolution transforming their former colonists into something other than estranged british subjects christopher flynn s engaging and timely book systematically examines for the first time the ways in which british writers depicted america and americans in the decades immediately following the revolutionary war flynn documents the evolution of what he regards as an essentially anthropological if also in some ways familial interest in the former colonies and their citizens on the part of british writers whether americans are idealized as the embodiments of sincerity and virtue or anathematized as intolerable and ungrateful louts flynn argues that the intervals between the acts of observing and writing and between writing and reading have the effect of distancing britain and america temporally as well as geographically flynn examines a range of canonical and noncanonical works sentimental novels of the 1780s and 1790s prose and poetry by wollstonecraft blake coleridge and wordsworth and novels and travel accounts by smollett lennox frances trollope and basil hall together they offer a complex and revealing portrait of americans as a breed apart which still resonates today

why did the founding fathers fail to include blacks and indians in their cherished proposition that all men are created equal the usual answer is racism but the reality is more complex and unsettling in bind us apart historian nicholas guyatt argues that from the revolution through the civil war most white liberals believed in the unity of all human beings but their philosophy faltered when it came to the practical work of forging a color blind society unable to convince others and themselves that racial mixing was viable white reformers began instead to claim that people of color could only thrive in separate republics in native states in the american west or in the west african colony of liberia herein lie the origins of separate but equal decades before reconstruction america s liberal elite was unable to imagine how people of color could become citizens of the united states throughout the nineteenth century native americans were pushed farther and farther westward while four million slaves freed after the civil war found themselves among a white population that had spent decades imagining that they would live somewhere else essential reading for anyone disturbed by america s ongoing failure to achieve true racial integration bind us apart shows conclusively that separate but equal represented far more than a southern backlash against emancipation it was a founding principle of our nation
